Field Operations Bureau

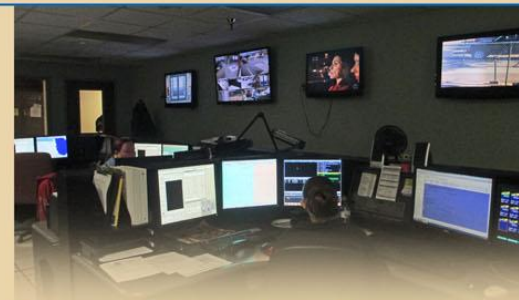
The Field Operations Bureau includes Patrol, Special Operations, Nuisance Abatement, Traffic Enforcement, Vehicle Investigations (collision and hit-and-run), Motorcycle Officers, Bicycle Patrol Officers, and the K9 Unit. Routine patrol functions are carried out by four platoons of officers operating on twelve-hour shift rotations for twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week coverage. Officers patrol within the city limits of Hot Springs, responding to citizens' calls for service and conducting proactive community policing activities.

Special Operations includes S.W.A.T., risk assessment planning, special events coordination, fleet management and K9 functions. Traffic Enforcement and Motorcycle Officers enforce traffic regulations, handle vehicle accidents, accident reconstruction and DWI enforcement; and conduct the Click-It or Ticket program. Nuisance Abatement deals with problem locations that require an abnormal amount of police response (i.e. bars, nightclubs, rental property, etc.).

Support Operations Bureau

The Police Department's Support Operations Bureau includes our Violent Crimes Unit, Property Crimes Unit, Street Crimes Unit, Crime Scene Unit, 911 Communications Center, Records Section, Warrants Section, Training Section, Public Information Office, Property & Evidence Section, and members of the Drug Task Force.

The Support Operations Bureau investigates homicides, rapes, assaults, robberies, child abuse, and domestic battery. The Property Crimes Unit investigates burglaries, thefts, forgeries and fraud. The Street Crimes Unit works street level narcotics and prostitution, along with assisting other units with investigations when needed.

The Drug Task Force is comprised of officers from the Hot Springs Police Department, Garland County Sheriffs Department and the Arkansas State Police. This unit is coordinated through the Garland County Prosecutor's Office (18th Judicial District East). The Drug Task Force works narcotics cases throughout Garland County. Nuisance Abatement assists both Street Crimes and the Drug Task Force in investigations involving residences used in illegal narcotics activity.
